Contact those who were once "students in distress" about non-distress-related topics as a means of periodic follow-up. Write several letters of recommendation for internships, awards, and special academic programs.

Select conference theme and keynote speaker for 12th Annual Conference of the Social Sciences. Recruit committee chairmen, event coordinators, presenters, and attendees for conference.
