EXIT EXAM INFORMATION


If you are **graduating** this summer, you must apply to graduate by July 6. Shortly thereafter, you will be added to the canvas course to take the exit exam. A few key points:

- ⇒ The exit exam is administered over a two-week period. We will let you know the dates as soon as we know them.
- \Rightarrow The exit exam is graded pass/fail, and you must earn a 60% to pass.
- ⇒ You get three attempts to pass the exam.
