Criminology and Law Major Requirements

There are <u>34 hours required for the major</u>. 22 of those hours must be taken from courses offered by the criminology and law program at UF to meet the major residency requirement. <u>Credits will count toward the major only if at least a C</u> grade is earned in the course. A maximum of 12 credits (or hours) for Criminology courses can be transferred from another university to apply toward the major. Of these, only 6 credits can be from 1000 or 2000 level classes. Students who transfer 6 of these lower division credits into the major should NOT take UF's CJL 2000.
