Course Description:

Gender can define our identities, shape our socialization, and provide us with fundamental opportunities and constraints- it is a principal tool for organizing all aspects of society. However, gender is often naturalized and taken for granted. Our task this semester is to "make the familiar strange" and interrogate the complex sociological significance of gender.

Course Objectives:

- Understand how gender can influence the distribution of valued resources, power, and privilege in society.
- Understand the ways in which gendered experiences vary based on the intersection of other social identities.
- Apply sociological concepts to understand how gender influences ideologies, lived experiences, and social institutions.

Required Text:

The following textbook is required for this course: *Gender: Ideas, Interactions, Institutions* written by Lisa Wade and Myra Marx Ferree. We will be using the <u>third edition</u>.

The textbook is available online as an e-book through **UF All Access**. If you choose to get the e-book through All Access, the cost will be billed to your UF account- specific instructions will be provided in Canvas the first week of class.

If you buy or rent a hard copy, you do <u>not</u> need to purchase access to the publisher's materials online (InQuizitive). Explore your options and choose the format that works best for you. Feel free to email me with questions.

I <u>do not</u> recommend buying the earlier edition of the textbook - the material has changed, and all quizzes, reading assignments, and coursework will use the current edition.

All other readings, audio, or video materials will be provided on Canvas.
